## ANGELS, a new European research project: which risk & which training?

ANGELS project (Augmented reality Network GEnerating Learning on Safety), is the training system that will revolutionize education and learning on safety and health at work, particularly in the hospital facilities.

This tool aims at innovating in terms of training on health and safety at work with the use of augmented reality (computer system that can superimpose 3D image on a real image to combine real and virtual).

The Needs Analysis began in The Czech Republic, France, Italy and Spain. It aims at evaluating the risks in standard and emergency situations in hospitals as well as the existing trainings. In addition, two groups consisting of health professionals and potential users are interviewed in each country to better determine what type of risk will be precisely covered in the training and what will the training include (cf. training kit).

This project is run by the University Hospital « Fondazione PTV Policlinico Tor Vergata » in Rome, Italy, and the consortium also includes the Management and Human Resources company MF & PARTNERS CONSULTING, the Italian Human Resources and Development firm Entropy KN, the Italian computer company Inglobe Technology (IT), the training center in paramedical care NCONZO in Brno, Czech Republic, and the applied psychology, clinical psychology and biopsychology department of the Spain university of Jaume 1 in Castellon, near Valencia.
